School-Wide Announcement

Problems happen. This week we will be talking about different ways to solve a problem that may arise. When a person has a problem, decisions need to be made. This is a process that involves you thinking about the steps to take to address the issue. Here is an easy three step process to use.

1. Pause and think about the problem.
 - What is happening?
 - Why is it a problem?
 - Should I speak with an adult about this or is it something I can handle on my own?
 - What are my choices?
 - What are the consequences for each option?
 - What will I do?
2. Take action.
 - Did I get the results I wanted?
 - What else do I need to do?
 - Do I need to talk with an adult?
3. Think about next time.
 - What will I do if something like this happens again?
 - Is there something I can do to prevent this from happening again?

Although every problem is different, a process like this will help you make the right choice for yourself.
