## Abington Public Schools FY-2022 Budget

The FY-2022 Budget Proposal of \$26,478,813 for the Abington Public Schools represents an effort to secure the necessary resources to provide the children of Abington with a high-quality educational program.

As this budget was developed, the following are important to note:

- This budget includes the funding needed for a full in-person return to school.
- This budget includes increases in areas to meet the needs of growing populations of students.
- Certain "built-in increases" for fixed or mandated costs will automatically cause our budget to increase.

ELE Teacher (English Language Learner) Abington High School/ Abington Middle School

Special Education Teacher Beaver Brook Elementary The ELE population continues to grow. The current teacher to student ratio is 1 to 34. This addition allows for better scheduled services across the district.

Increase and improve services in Partial Inclusion setting for moderate needs students.

Special Education Paraprofessional Beaver Brook Elementary Support for incoming students from the AEEP.

Grade 5 Teacher Abington Middle School Decreases projected class size from 29 to 24.

STEAM Teacher (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) Abington Middle School

Computer and Network Technician

Reduces the number of students in science classes from 29 to 24 and improves scheduling for Middle School Model.

2500 students & staff created 4600 Helpdesk tickets this year for an office of two. The use of computers, software, alarm, security camera, phones and online services are best maximized with increased support.
